#### The Attributes of a Great Mother

### (2 Timothy 1:3-5)

One of the closet people to the Apostle Paul was a young man by the name of Timothy (2 Timothy 1:2). Paul met Timothy while preaching in Lystra. By this time Timothy had developed a reputation of being a young man of integrity and influence (Acts 16:1-2). Paul immediately took a liking to Timothy and asked him to travel with him preaching the gospel.

Paul told the brethren in Philippi that Timothy was trustworthy, caring and a hard worker (Philippians 2:19-22). How did Timothy develop these characteristics?

Timothy became a great man of faith in large part because of the upbringing he received from his mother Eunice. From her life we learn that a great mother possesses at least four important attributes.

I.	She instills in	children	•

- A. See 2 Timothy 3:14-15.
  - 1. When Paul mentions the sacred writings, he is talking about the scriptures (specifically the writings of the Old Testament).
  - 2. From the time Timothy was child his mother taught him God's word (2 Timothy 1:3-5).
- B. Like Eunice, a great mother gives her children consistent teaching from the Bible from a young age.

# II. She instills in her children a sincere

- A. Timothy certainly had this in his life (2 Timothy 1:5).
  - 1. When Paul says Timothy had a sincere faith, he literally means his faith was non-hypocritical.
  - 2. Timothy's faith was gained from the right source (Romans 10:17).
  - 3. Timothy developed this by watching his mother (Titus 2:3-5).
- B. Like Eunice, a great mother doesn't just teach her children the truth, but lives it in front of them every day!

# III. She instills in her children a desire to

- A. Timothy was from the same city where Paul was stoned and left to die (Acts 14:19).
  - 1. And yet, Timothy still accepted an invitation to travel with Paul preaching (2 Timothy 3:10-11).
  - 2. This kind of commitment to serve in the kingdom could not have been easily developed unless it was first encouraged at home.
- B. Like Eunice, a great mother encourages her children to be active in the work of God.

# IV. She is willing to do these things \_\_\_\_\_\_ is she has to.

- A. This is not to say that Timothy's father was not a good man and father. But it is pretty obvious that he left no spiritual mark on his son (Acts 16:1).
- B. It has never been God's will for a mother to raise the children to serve God by herself (Ephesians 6:4; Proverbs 20-21). But sometimes that's how it is. If you grew up in a situation like Timothy, thank God that you have a mother like Eunice!
