## The Christian and the 2016 Election

Let's just be honest about it, many of us are very emotional and passionate about this election. We are worried about. We really want Tuesday to go our way. This is obvious when you look at what disciples are posting on social media sites. For many they are using social media as a venue to promote a particular candidate and argue with others over the opposition. The devil is certainly aware of how emotional many of us are over this election and he will try to use this to divide and conquer us.

With that in mind, let's spend a few moments emphasizing some important things we need to remember as the day approached when we will be electing new leaders.

## I. Remember to <u>stay united</u>!

- A. The unity we have as God's people is fragile. If we are not careful our attitude towards the outcome of the election can divide us as the family of God.
  - 1. Do you think God wants His people to be divided over politics? Of course not!
  - 2. As Christians we are part of something much bigger than political parties.
  - 3. We must stay united as a family regardless of the outcome Tuesday (1 Peter 2:9-10; John 17:20-21; 1 Corinthians 1:10; Ephesians 4:1-3).
- B. According to Ephesians 4:4-6, as Christians we are bound by the...
  - 1. one **<u>body</u>**.
  - 2. one <u>spirit</u>.
  - 3. one <u>hope</u>.
  - 4. one <u>Lord</u>.
  - 5. one <u>faith</u>.
  - 6. one <u>baptism</u>.
  - 7. one <u>God and Father</u>.

## II. You have <u>influence</u>!

- A. Every disciple has this.
  - 1. We need to remember this when on social media.
  - 2. We never need to debate **politics** on social media.
- B. It sends a bad **message** (Matthew 5:16; Philippians 2:15; John 17:21).
  - 1. Instead <u>stay away</u> from politics on social media (Proverbs 17:14).
  - 2. Instead exercise <u>discipline</u> and restraint (Proverbs 17:27-28).
  - 3. Instead be <u>wise</u> and make the most of your <u>time</u> (Ephesians 5:15-17).

## III. Remember who is in <u>control</u> !

- A. <u>God</u> is ultimately in control! See Psalm 47:8; 113:4-5; Daniel 4:17; Matthew 28:18-20; Revelation 17:14; 19:6. Remember this will help you sleep well Tuesday night regardless of what happens.
- B. Regardless of what happens, <u>trust</u> God because His cause will ultimately <u>prevail</u> !
