Gifts from God

This is the time of the year when many are buying and exchanging gifts. While there is nothing wrong with being able to do that, it is important to understand that God has given us gifts as well. In fact, God is the greatest giver of gifts! What gifts has God given us?

I. The gift of <u>stuff</u>

- A. This would include many of the things we found wrapped under our tree this morning.
 - 1. Every material thing we possess comes from God.
 - 2. It is that stuff that if we work hard and are good stewards, God wants us to enjoy (1 Timothy 6:17; Ecclesiastes 3:12-13; 5:19-20).
- B. With this gift comes...
 - 1. The responsibility of **sharing** (1 Timothy 6:17-18).
 - 2. The challenge to not put our <u>trust</u> in it (Matthew 6:33).
 - 3. The need to be **thankful** (Colossians 4:2).

II. The gift of <u>children</u>

- A. Solomon says they are indeed a blessings (Psalm 127:3-5).
 - 1. There is no price tag you can put on hearing your children say, "I love you" or your child giving you a hug.
 - 2. Since becoming a parent, I have found myself more absorbed in seeing my children's happiness than my own.
- B. With this gift comes...
 - 1. The responsibility of **stewardship** (Ephesians 6:4).
 - 2. A challenge to understand that we have a responsibility to help give these gifts back to God.

III. The gift of <u>talent</u>

- A. Every Christian has received a gift to serve in the kingdom of God (1 Peter 4:10-11)
 - 1. This gift comes from God and is to be used for the glory of God.
 - 2. Our gifts differ, but they are all equally important (Romans 12:4-8).
- B. With this gift comes...
 - 1. A stewardship.
 - 2. The responsibility of **nurturing** and **developing** them.

IV. The gift of Jesus (2 Corinthians 9:15)

- A. The gifts we have received over the past few hours...
 - 1. Will get old and at some point and break down (Matthew 6:19-20).
 - 2. Will eventually lose their luster.
 - 3. Won't bring us long lasting happiness (Ecclesiastes 2:1-11).
- B. But the gift of salvation through Jesus...
 - 1. Is **perfect** (James 1:17).
 - 2. Is **undeserving** (Ephesians 2:8-9).
 - 3. Was purchased at the greatest **price** (1 Peter 1:18-19).
 - 4. Satisfies our greatest **need** (John 4:13-14).
 - 5. Will always be **needed** (John 11:25).
